

Confirmation Requirements

2022-2023 (updated 9.6.22)

What is Confirmation?

Confirmation and baptism are deeply connected. Confirmation is a period of study and faith formation, where by young people can engage in and understand the fundamental promises made at their baptism. The students affirm those promises and in so doing they commit themselves to a life of devotion to God, of communion with the church, and service to others.

Simply put, confirmation is the affirmation of baptism. This means that the purpose of confirmation is to affirm, sustain, uphold, and encourage our young people as they deepen their understanding of the promises made at their baptism; and to help them understand what a life of discipleship means. The confirmation curriculum does this by addressing the promises (seen below) made in baptism over the course of two years.

These are the promises taken directly from the ELW: “to live with them among God's faithful people, bring them to the word of God and the holy supper, teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in their hands the holy scriptures, and nurture them in faith and prayer, so that your children may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace. ”

What does the confirmation program consist of?

Our confirmation program is at its heart a small group ministry. Each of the students are placed within a small group with one or two adult leaders. The leaders of each group foster both connection and learning within the small group. The small group leaders are not only teachers but mentors as well.

Each month (typically during the school year) confirmation will meet on Wednesdays from 7:15P.M. to 8:15P.M. The last Wednesday of each month the small groups will meet together for a time of fellowship and service. At the end of the two years, in the fall of their 10th grade year, the student will get to affirm their faith publicly, through the confirmation worship service held on Reformation Sunday.

What are the requirements for confirmation?

1. Attendance:

Attendance is required at all scheduled large and small group events as well as special events. If a student has more than four absences (including illness), they will be required to meet privately with one of the pastors to make up the material that was missed. If a student leaves class early for or arrives late from a sport practice, it will be counted as an absence.

If a student is ill on the day of confirmation, a parent needs to let the small group leader know that the child will be absent.

2. Worship:

Worship is an important part of our lives as Christians. This is the place where we are fed spiritually and grow in our relationship with God and our community of faith.

All confirmation students are required to come to worship regularly.

Confirmation students are also expected to complete worship notes. ***Each student will be required to complete 20 worship notes & 5 worship help.***

- 20– worship notes– 10 need to be IN-PERSON (complete worship note & have signed by Pastor Phil or Angie)***
- 5 worship help-complete worship note (Complete worship note)***
 - **POWERPOINT (need to ONLY complete Sermon part...please indicate powerpoint on note)***

Worship help includes a wide variety of activities including but not limited to the following: worship leadership (reading, ushering, communion, PowerPoint, acolyting, etc.), participation in worship groups (offering special music, Easter sunrise service, church school, etc) If you are not sure whether something will count as worship participation please contact Kama Hoovestol. Sign-up for acolyting and PowerPoint can be found on the website under Confirmation. Call Jackie for usher, communion, etc.

Fill out worship note and indicated the worship help that you complete on the note. Please have Pastor Phil or Angie sign your worship note.

Worship notes can be found website under Confirmation as a digital version or paper copies can be found in back of Narthex.

3. Service Projects:

A life of discipleship is marked by love of God and service to others. Because of this *each confirmation student will be responsible for participating in a minimum of 25 hours of service work over a two year period.*

Service work is defined as work done in service to others with out payment. This would include work done through other organizations like 4-H, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc.

There are half sheet forms located in the narthex to fill out each time your student completes a service project or service activity.

Please note that there will be a limited amount of service projects offered up throughout the year for confirmation students, but the burden of service work falls on the student not the small group leader or pastoral leadership.

4. Retreat/Bible Camp

Students are not required to attend a retreat/bible camp, however, they can receive credit for 4 Worship notes for attending. Must fill out a worship note...put dates of retreat/bible camp & where. On back of form, please give a 10 sentence description of what you learned/did at the retreat/bible camp.

5. Faith Statement:

Before the end of the second year confirmation students will be asked to write a Statement of Faith. A few of these statements will be read during the confirmation service. A handout with instructions will be given out to explain what a faith statement is and what will be expected before the statements are due.

What other information do I need to know?

There is a one time cost of \$25 for Confirmation.

This money goes to purchase BIBLES and materials that your student will use throughout confirmation and will get to keep after they are confirmed.
